Hello Everyone! Thanks for a great renewal season. PaSRBA currently has 311 principal members. We had 65 members who did not renew their memberships, however, we had 75 new memberships.

On March 1, 2018 we have 30 affiliated clubs and one club who is in the process of moving their ARBA charter, so they can become a PaSRBA affiliated club. In those clubs there are 777 affiliated members. Affiliated Membership:

Clubs wishing to affiliate with PaSRBA must send a membership roster with name and address of all members to the PaSRBA membership chair. Your members will not be eligible for the PaSRBA sweepstakes if a roster is not available. All individual members of affiliated clubs have an affiliated membership with PaSRBA. If any individual wishes to have additional member benefits

(such as those listed below), those individuals need to pay separately for a principal membership.

Principal Membership Benefits:

- Annual Directory of Members
 - Quarterly Newsletter
 - Membership Card
- PaSRBA Sweepstakes Points
- Voting Rights (PA Adults Only)
- Royalty, Management, Achievement, and other contests. (PA Youth Only)
 - Youth Scholarships

Affiliated Clubs must be located within Pennsylvania, hold a current ARBA Charter and the PaSRBA director must be a member of ARBA.

INSURANCE:

We issued 1 certificate so far for 2018.

All insurance policies are up to date.

Reminder for clubs that they need to have their affiliated membership paid and the show is to be PaSRBA sanctioned in-order to use the general liability policy as an additional insured to cover their event. In order for a club to use PaSRBA General Liability insurance policy and have a Certificate of Liability issued for your club's show when requested by the location for your show. Your club appointed director must have attended 2 of 3 PaSRBA board meetings within the past year unless your club is a new club or newly affiliated within PaSRBA the past year. Your show must also be sanctioned with PaSRBA. Fee is \$100.00 per year (Youth clubs have free insurance coverage). Any questions contact MaryAnn Barbacow at Barbacow@comcast.net. Showmanship & Posters – Deb Schmittel. Great contest this year.



Royalty Court Bios

Queen- Lauren Turner

Hi, my name is Lauren Turner and I am proud to be representing the Pennsylvania State Rabbit Breeder's Association as your 2018 PaSRBA Queen. I am sixteen years old, am currently in tenth grade, and homeschooled. I live near Philipsburg, Pennsylvania with my Mom and Dad, and my sister Sydney. We own a farmette and raise rabbits, have several horses, and chickens. The name of our rabbitry is Turners' Rabbit Habit and we raise Dwarf Hotots, Mini Rex, English Spots, Britannia Petites, and Californians. My parents are 4-H leaders and my brother and sisters have been very active with 4-H, so I grew up around animals. Dwarf Hotots are the main breed I raise and show, and I also raise Mini Rex, and Californians. I enjoy going on community service trips with my 4-H club to visit nursing homes, classrooms, or other 4-H clubs to do rabbit breed demonstrations and rabbit hopping clinics, and to host rabbit hopping competitions at rabbit shows across the state. I have also had the privilege of going to ARBA Convention in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, Fort Worth Texas, and Indianaopolis, Indiana to show my rabbits and participate in the Youth Contests, and Rabbit Hopping. My mom and dad both help run the Pennsylvania State Rabbit Breeders Association Convention, and I am starting to help out as well. My parents were some of the highest people running the 2013 ARBA Convention in Harrisburg, PA. I love rabbits and love to learn about them. I also have Buff Orpington chickens and Khaki Campbell ducks.
